## Who is the Children's Ministry Team?

Our children and families are a part of the church. Members of the church are called to build up one another in truth and love; this includes teaching and building up our children.

The Children's Ministry team is made up of both parent and non-parent volunteers who disciple and equip our children with christ-center principles.



## Available Roles of Children's Ministry

There are five different roles in Children's Ministry. These different roles lend themselves to the diverse strengths and gifts of the different members of the church.

### Prayer

Take prayer requests and lead prayer time during Children's Church

### Catechism

Lead children in the recital of the New City Catechism during Children's Church

### Nursery

Supervise and play with babies and toddlers in the Nursery

### Teacher\*

Lead a 15 minute (or shorter) bible study during Children's Church. Pre-written curriculum provided.

### Activity Coordinator\*

Lead a pre-written craft, activity, or game that corresponds to the lesson taught in the Bible Study.

\*Position is considered a leadership role that is specialized in nature, experience not necessarily required.

## How Do Parents Help?

After a child or family has been attending Children's Ministry/Church for a consistent period of time, both parents are asked to volunteer to serve in Children's Ministry once per month.

Both parents will be scheduled to serve on the same Sunday so that spouses are not separated multiple Sundays per month.

No single role will require the parent to create their own material. Each role is equipped with pre-written curriculum prepared for them.
