Closed Churches amidst COVID-19 Pandemic, while Condoning Hundreds Protesting in the Streets

Newsom issued stay-at-home orders on March 19th, 2020. He ordered the closing of places of worship and restricted their capacity. (gov.ca.gov) In June, he stated and tweeted "Everyone has the right to protest peacefully," contrary to his strict restrictions for churches. Granted Clemency for Felons: Those Who Raped, Murdered, and Committed Heinous Crimes Against Children

In 2020, Gov. Newsom reduced the sentences of 26 California prison inmates, including 10 convicted of homicides, and granted 5 other pardons. (sacbee.com, gov.ca.gov)

Expanded Access to Abortion for College Students

Signed SB 24, requiring student health centers located on campuses within the University of California or California State University system to provide abortion pills after January 1, 2023.

Signed Bill that Allows Male Inmates to Transfer to Women's Prisons

September 26, 2020, Newsom signed SB 132 into law, allowing men who identify as transgender to transfer to female prisons. Since the signing of the bill, hundreds of men have already requested transfers. These men are not required to obtain any trans services such as hormone treatment or surgeries.

AB 2218 was signed by Newsom on September 26, 2020. The bill allows minors with gender dysphoria to be given cross-sex hormones that can cause sterilization.
