Outlawed Suspension and Expulsion of Defiant Students

In 2019, signed a law that prohibits the suspension of any pupil in kindergarten or grades 1 to 5, and the expulsion of any pupil in kindergarten through 12th grade who disrupts school activities or otherwise willfully defies the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, or school officials.

Signed Bill that Allows Male Inmates to Transfer to Women's Prisons

September 26, 2020, Newsom signed SB 132 into law, allowing men who identify as transgender to transfer to female prisons. Since the signing of the bill, hundreds of men have already requested transfers. These men are not required to obtain any trans services such as hormone treatments or surgeries.
